Lunchtime Seminar Multi-Level Modeling in Language Education Research

Speaker: Prof Steven J. Ross School of Policy Studies Kwansei Gakuin University, Japan

Abstract

The seminar will feature an introduction to hierarchical linear modeling. Participants will receive a handout with a step by step guide to setting up, running and interpreting a multi-level model featuring an analysis of the effect of training on student perception of the validity of peer assessment. A second example will demonstrate the execution of a multi-level analysis of the impact of school leadership, which features the influence of institutional organization on equalizing achievement outcomes.

Steven J. Ross (Ph.D. from University of Hawaii in SLA) is a professor at the School of Policy Studies at Kwansei Gakuin University in Kobe-Sanda, Japan. He specializes in quantitative research methods, language assessment, and program evaluation. His research on language assessment and SLA has appeared in *Studies in Second Language Acquisition*, *IRAL*, *Journal of Asian-Pacific Communication*, *Second Language Research*, *TESOL Quarterly*, *System*, *Language Learning*, *Applied Linguistics*, *Prospect*, *Language Testing*, and *International Journal of Testing*. He has been a member of the editorial boards of *JLTA Journal*, *TESOL Quarterly*, *Language Testing* and *Applied Linguistics*.
