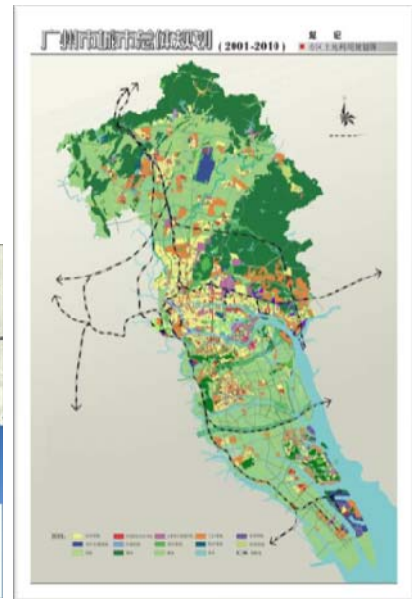
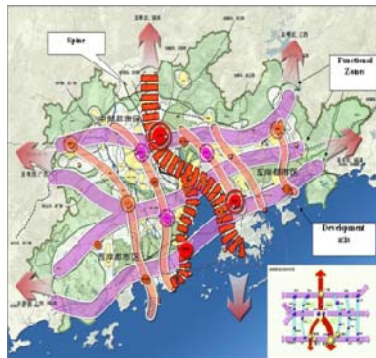


CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CPD) SEMINARS

What is it about?

The rise of China has drawn the world's attention in recent decades. The transformation of urban spaces formed under a centrally planned economy to spaces that can facilitate the operation of market mechanisms in a socialist economy has presented formidable challenges and huge opportunities to the urban planning profession. The proposed CPD seminars will focus on contemporary urban planning laws and practices in post-reform China, covering the history of urban planning, urban planning legislation and administration, and urban planning practices at the regional and local levels.

Who should participate?

The seminar series should be of interest to planners and lay persons who would like to have a deeper understanding of urban and regional planning issues in China. The seminars are open for application to all, especially members of various planning-related professional bodies.

Format: Lectures with class discussions. The seminars will be conducted in English.
