In this talk, Dr. Leutzsch will introduce conceptual history and iconology, taking the example of Carl Schmitt's influence on Reinhart Koselleck. To become political, a concept or a monument needs always a counter-part. Therefore the talk will close with the question: what happens if there are no counter-concepts anymore?
