The failure of major stakeholders to collaborate and to take decisive action threatens human existence. At the same time, as emphasized by climate justice, those countries that have been the largest emitters of carbon emissions have the greatest responsibility to help those countries that, while not having been large emitters, will suffer first and worst from the climate emergency. It is crucial to enhance understanding and communication of the complexity of the issues involved, and to hold those who cause climate change accountable. As the key institutions of knowledge creation and knowledge transfer, what role do universities have in educating and communicating about the planetary risks? How well do they draw the roadmap of resilience building? How can we ensure that these plans are comprehensive and equitable, and that there is a shared understanding of the agenda among stakeholders?
