SPEAKERS

John Norcini (USA)



Dr. Norcini is the President and Chief Executive Officer of FAIMER (Foundation for Advancement of International Medical Education and Research). Dr. Norcini worked at the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) prior to FAIMER for previous 25 years. He held two senior positions at ABIM from 1988 to 1997 and from 1997 until 2002. His principal academic interest is in the area of the

assessment of physician performance. He is on the editorial Boards of five peer-reviewed journals in measurement and medical education and has published extensively. Current major research interests include methods for setting standards, assessing practice performance, and testing professional competence.

Greg Tan (Australia)



Professor Greg Tan was the foundation Head of the School of Biomedical Science, University of Notre Dame Australia (UNDA) and is currently the Head of Biomedical Science in the School of Health Sciences. He completed his Ph D degree in the School of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, University of Queensland. He has a strong interest in Medical Education, and he has been an external examiner to several medical universities overseas. An

advocate of problem-based learning (PBL), he has developed a model of online case discussion which he uses either separately or as an adjunct to PBL.

David Fairholm (Canada)



Dr. Fairholm, who is a neurosurgeon at heart, is also one of the experts who put an emphasis of his work in the field of medical education. He has been showing his interest in this field by working in several countries to help other faculties of medicine, including Taiwan and Indonesia.

Currently, he has completed his diploma in medical education by extension from the University of

Dundee in Scotland. He once holds the position of the Assistant Dean for Faculty Development and participated in the strategic planning process for the undergraduate curriculum reform in the University of British Columbia.

Ara Tekian (USA)



Ara Tekian (Ph.D., MHPE University of Illinois at Chicago) is Associate Professor of Medical Education and Director of International Affairs in the Department of Medical Education, University of Illinois at Chicago. Dr. Tekian also served as a consultant to the World Health Organization Eastern Mediterranean Regional Office as well as to many other institutions and agencies. He consults both nationally and internationally and has organized and conducted over 140

international workshops in more than 35 countries and 55 cities. His current research interests include curriculum planning and evaluation for medical schools, student assessment and innovative testing methodologies, instructional technology, selection and retention of underrepresented minorities in medical schools, and international health professions education.

Gordon Page (Canada)



Dr. Gordon Page is a health professions educator who especially focuses in assessment of clinical competence of trainees and practitioners in medical education. He has been working in this field for more than 30 years now and has been working and helping faculties of medicine worldwide in areas related to medical and health education. Dr. Page's background education comprises of a combined honours degree in mathematics and physics from the University of Victoria, a post-graduate diploma in secondary

education also from the University of Victoria, and a masters and doctoral degree in science education from the University of British Columbia.

Professor Grace Tang is very well known for her dedication in the field of medical education, aside to her specialist in Obstetric and Gynecology. She has been the Chairman of Management Committee of the Asian Medical Education Association for about six years, from 2001 to 2007.
