Dr Chiu is currently Clinical Assistant Professor at the Department of Psychiatry, University of Hong Kong. A research clinician of the Psychotic disorders Study and Intervention (PSI) program at the University of Hong Kong, she has been involved in many research projects regarding psychotic disorders including longitudinal studies of the early course of psychotic disorders such as the First Episode Psychosis Study (FEP), First Episode Schizophrenia Study (FES), and in a international collaboration (IPSOS) the pathway to care for people with psychotic disorders. The question of relapse and maintenance treatment was addressed by the Relapse Prevention Study (RPS), while the Historical Control Study (HCS) evaluated the Early Assessment Service for Young People (EASY) against standard care in terms of clinical outcome and service utilisation. She is also active in projects on stigma, metabolic side effects of antipsychotics, medication adherence, group-work for carers, recovery, violence in psychosis. Her work on paternal age effect on the early outcome of schizophrenia suggested poorer prognosis for those with higher paternal ages, and it is hoped that further extended study of these patients will shed more light on other prognostic outcomes.
