This Institute also aims to improve students' capacities to apply the materials and ideas to which they have been exposed to different settings and encourage a further interest in Asian affairs.


From Global Society to 'Heart of Asia'

Study Tours and Site Visits: Macau, Beijing

Special study tours and visits to Macau and Beijing will be arranged in collaboration with Macau University and China Foreign Affairs University. In addition to academic lectures, seminars, social activities and survival Putonghua courses will also be offered on an optional basis. In order to increase participants' understanding of local culture as well as to foster multicultural interaction, local students will be invited to act as ambassadors for visiting students whilst in Hong Kong and during the study tour in Beijing.

Eligibility

The Institute is open to undergraduate students from any academic discipline who are interested in learning about the recent development of China and Asia on the world stage. Applicants should have completed at least one year of study at their home institution and be proficient in English and computing.

Credit Transfer

Credits will be awarded to those who have successfully completed the programme. Most universities and colleges around the world recognise and accept grades and credits from the University of Hong Kong (HKU). However, students should confirm with their home university as to whether it will accept credits from HKU before they apply.

Accommodations

Students will be assigned student dormitories at the Universities of Hong Kong and Macau. All rooms are air-conditioned and well-furnished. Each floor has its own pantry and is equipped with basic cooking facilities. In Beijing, they will be housed in the International Exchange Centre at the China Foreign Affairs University.





Visa Application

All non-local students are required to obtain a student visa to Hong Kong and /or tourist visas to the Mainland China and Macau. Students from overseas can choose to lodge their visa application via the local Chinese Embassy or via the Centre of Development and Resources for Students (CEDARS) of HKU.
