Stein Kuhnle (born 1947) is Professor of Comparative Politics, University of Bergen, Norway, and Professor of Comparative Social Policy, Hertie School of Governance, Berlin, Germany. He is also Adjunct Professor at the Centre for Welfare State Research, University of Southern Denmark, Odense, Denmark. He graduated with a cand. polit. degree from the University of Bergen in 1973, with a dissertation on "Social Mobilization and Political Participation: The Nordic Countries ca. 1850-1970". He has been a visiting fellow/professor at Australian National University, Canberra; European University Institute, Florence, Italy; University of Mannheim, Germany; University of California, Berkeley, USA; The Brookings Institution, Washington, D.C.; The London School of Economics, UK.
