Master of Arts in Transport Policy and Planning

- 1. Applications are invited for admission in September 2024 programme leading to the degree of Master of Arts in Transport Policy and Planning. To be eligible for admission to the programme, a candidate shall satisfy both the University admission requirements and the programme specific requirements as listed below:
 - (a) shall comply with the <u>General Regulations</u> and the Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula;
 - (b) shall hold
 - (i) a Bachelor's degree of this University or
 - (ii) another qualification of equivalent standard from this University or from another university or comparable institution accepted for this purpose*;
 - (c) for a candidate who is seeking admission on the basis of a qualification from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong of which the language of teaching and/or examination is not English, shall satisfy the University English language requirement applicable to higher degrees as prescribed under General Regulation G2(b)**; and
 - (d) shall satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination if required.
 - * Qualifications which are accepted include the Chartered Membership of The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport (Hong Kong).

- 2. The curriculum shall extend over one academic year for full-time study and two academic years for the two-year part-time study, or three academic years for the three-year part-time study. It provides professional training in this field and emphasizes the latest developments in transport studies.
- 3. Applications for this taught postgraduate programme and payment of application fee (HK\$300 per application) should be made through the HKU on-line application system at https://aal.hku.hk/tpg/.
- 4. The composition fee for the 2024-2025 intake is HK\$160,000 for local students and HK\$180,000 for non-local students (subject to the University's approval). The composition fee is payable by instalments as listed below:


